Submissions assessed by The Association for NVR Practice at a cost of £300 (certification will also renew NVR Accredited Practitioner status) Reaccreditation certification confirmed within 3 months.</p> <p>Requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Confirmation of ongoing practice in the area of training. *40 hours of supervised NVR (to include delivering training and groups) with 4 supervision sessions per year (one supervision of 1.5 hrs can be an open peer supervision group). *Submission of a practice history summary (to include a description of current role, type of work you do, main responsibilities in relation to NVR practice, people you communicate with in relation to NVR practice) *Completion of a minimum of 12 hours CPD per year with record including: reading, attendance at conferences, workshops, evidence of development of NVR practice and knowledge.
