<p>accreditation:</p>	<p>Submissions assessed by The NVR Association at a cost of £300 (certification will also renew NVR Accredited Practitioner status) Reaccreditation certification confirmed within 3 months.</p> <p>Requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">*Confirmation of ongoing practice.*40 hours of supervised individual NVR practise with 4 supervision sessions per year (one supervision of 1.5 hrs can be an open peer supervision group).*Submission of a practice history summary (to include a description of current role, type of work you do, main responsibilities in relation to NVR practice, people you communicate with in relation to NVR practice)*Completion of a minimum of 12 hours CPD per year with record including: reading, attendance at conferences, workshops, evidence of development of NVR practice and knowledge.*Yearly record of CPD undertaken kept by the practitioner and submitted 5 yearly. <p>NB: CPD 50% of which must be NVR specific and the other 50% in related fields. CPD form and guidance can be downloaded from the Accreditation area of the website.</p>
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
